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About PAHAL

PAHAL JAN SAHAYOG VIKAS SANSTHAN, Indore (M.P.) is registered under “Society Registration Act 1973”. It has been working in Indore city and also associated with other district of Madhya Pradesh since 2003. It has vast experience on working with gender issues including gender based studies in the city of Indore, Barwani, Jhabua and in Bhopal. The organization is of international and national repute and recognized by Voluntary Support Organization (**VSO International, UK**) under International Citizen Services on 'Secure Livelihoods through communication and gender participation' and **TISS**, Mumbai and **ISSW**, Indore for deputing the post graduate students to learn and gain the skills of social development and complete the internship/field works. PAHAL, from 2003 to 2014, undertook programs specifically to provide succor to distressed girls and women. Providing personalized counseling, guidance and training to needy women facing domestic violence and other gender-based problems, besides conducting several gender-sensitization programs for varied target groups esp. adolescent girl, boys and young women.

PAHAL is providing its services as a resource agency on the issue of Gender equity and women rights. Throughout the state PAHAL organize capacity building programs for various Government and Non Government Organizations. PAHAL involves in establishing of CASH (Committee against Sexual Harassment). At field level PAHAL actively involves in sensitization/orientation programs on Domestic Violence Act 2005, Violence against women and promotion of gender equity laws. PAHAL also counsel the victims of domestic violence and harassment and guide them about the legal procedures, assistance in help from protection officers, police department, Women & Child Department and also facilitate the victims to link with HRLN (Human Resource Law Network) for legal assistance.

PAHAL is also a part of FEM (Forum to Engage Men), Men's Action for Stopping Violence against Women (MASVAW), T.B. partnership India (PTCC), . These are national level Network which seek help in designing of program activities and log frame of the project especially in the field of Men/boys against Violence. Against Women PAHAL is also a part of international network CWGL for 16 days activism on violence against women.

Community Medical Centre, Khajrana Indore



At the start of year 2013 Pahal & Volvo Employee Aid Association jointly initiated a community medical centre at Khajrana slum in Indore. The aim of “Community Medical Centre” is to provide free access of health services to poor slum dwellers of Khajrana and surrounding areas. Since January 2013 our community medical centre expands health care facilities to “Out Patient Department”, Inner Patient Department, general health checkups, vaccinations, Lab. Investigations, distribution of medicines, counseling of girls/women on safe motherhood & nutrition and slum awareness meetings on health issues arises in slums. In these two years we not only provide free health services to poor people but also develop reputation and faith among the opinion leaders, people and administration. In the year 2014-15 it caters its services to approx. **12000** patients.



Economic Rehabilitation Program

PAHAL promotes means of livelihood among marginalized community of Indore and Barwani. PAHAL aims enhance and upliftment of such economically fragile and marginalized community PAHAL started employment/self employment driven vocational training courses, these courses provided either free or at a very nominal cost. Pahal imparts trainings on trades like medical & nursing, Sewing & tailoring and Godri making.

Gender Equity Programs



Pahal is well recognized as Gender resource centre & gender training institute. In the year 2014-2015 PAHAL conducted trainings for departments like EPF , ESI hospital, Police Department, National Institute of Public Cooperation, Child Development, Women & Child Department, NGOs and corporate. In this year organization has accomplished 50 trainings & 1200 people were benefited. Every year sensitization/orientation on Gender equality organized at Indore, Barwani, Bhopal, Dhar, Alirajpur and Jhabua.



VAW Campaign

Since 2005 Pahal Jan Sahyog Vikas Sansthan is regularly running a 16 Days of Activism Campaign to make people aware on the negative impact of violence on women and children and to act against abuse, to eliminate all kinds of gender violence. 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence starts from 25 November, International Violence Against Women's Day and end on the International Human Rights Day (10 December). It also includes other important days like AIDS Day, Disability Day etc.



Special Schools for Children engage in work



To provide education to working children Pahal's special school gives working & dropout children a chance to complete their education and acquire skills for employment. In this school participatory methods are adopted to give them chance to understand their situation, their rights & opportunities. Apart from formal education children learnt extra curriculum activities like Life Skills Education and vocational trainings leading to personality development. In this year 100 children were benefited from Special School under National Child Labour Program.



T.B. Awareness Program



PAHAL conducted T.B. awareness program at vulnerable and marginalized areas of Indore and Barwani district. To increase case detection rate organization conduct meetings with village Health and Sanitation Committee, Youth groups, urban slums and ward members also conducted various community events to aware the communities on T.B. In this year 42 community meetings and 20 mid media activities were conducted covering approx. 5000 persons during the program.



SAMBAL (Strengthening the Children)



The “SAMBAL” project is focus on Nutrition, Health, Education and Livelihood in 10 effected villages of Barwani (M.P). The project aims to aware beneficiaries on nutrition and health promoting vaccination & best health practices through linkages with WCD and NRHM. Dropout children are provided education through special classes and to be linked with formal education. Linkages with National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), government welfare schemes to promote livelihood and to ensure holistic development of villagers. Project is supported by tdh (terres des hommes).



Safe City Initiative Program



The “Safe City Initiative Program ” aims to end “Violence against Women” in selected 53 slums of Indore and 52 slums of Bhopal through different intervention models. The project envisages working with the women and Young Boy. It seeks to study and develop different models which can then be scaled up or replicated in other areas of the city and other cities. One of the important sections is the youth who are much more vulnerable to sexual abuse and violence especially in the slums. The program is running in collaboration with DFID and District municipal corporation.



Goonj Cloth for Work

In association with GOONJ, PAHAL promotes cloth for work to encourage old clothes as a developmental resource rather than charitable item. Communities are motivated to identify the pressing development needs of their own area. They are encouraged to do shramdaan (community labor) and get material in return, with dignity; as a reward. It helps develop a stronger relationship between our local partner organization and the communities.



Aarogyam MMU (DLF)

To deliver health care services at underserved area of rural Indore DLF foundation, IGD and PA-HAL is operating Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) at Mundla Baag, Balya Khara and Sula Khedi vil-lages. The purpose is to provide qualitative pre-ventive, promotive and curative health & hygi-enic services to the popu-lations residing in the project area. Services of DLF Mobile Medical Unit are free of charge including medicines for the residents of Sulak-hedi, Mundla Baag and Balyakhedi.



Bridging the Digital Divide



Digital divides refers to the gap between those with regular, effective access to digital and information technology, and those without this access. The people who are not able to access ICT services on the basis of gender, physical disability, physical access, age, access to the contents and lack of ICT skills contribute to the Digital Divide. This project address the issue of bridging the by imparting the knowledge regarding ICT among youth also aware them about their right to information. The project Bridging the Digital Divide is serving the ICT knowledge and awareness at Bhil Pal-tan, Badla and Rahul Gandhi Nagar at In-dore. Project is running in collaboration with Vikas Samvad.

Life Skills Education Program



PAHAL runs Life Skills Education Program for adolescents of Indore and Barwani. The aim is to provide the “abilities for adaptive and positive behavior that enable individuals to deal effectively with the demands and challenges of everyday life”. PAHAL implement the manual of LSE based on the 10 core Life Skills defined by the WHO. Life skills education is designed to facilitate the practice and reinforcement of psychosocial skills in a culturally and developmentally appropriate way; it contributes to the promotion of personal and social development, the prevention of health and social problems, and the protection of human rights. In this year 300 adolescents benefited from this program.
