



Beside these 3 districts of Madhya Pradesh PAHAL is also doing capacity building programs as a resource NGO for Dindori, Mandla, Balaghat, Tikamgarh, Panna, Chattarpur and Jhabua districts on gender, livelihood and ARSH issues.

PAHAL also Act as a resource agency for various state and national level programs. The Organization is of international and national repute and recognized by Voluntary Support Organization (VSO International, UK) under International Citizen Services on 'Secure Livelihoods through communication and gender participation' and TISS, Mumbai and ISSW, Indore for deputing the post graduate students to learn and gain the skills of social development and complete the internship/field works.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

(a) Gender Equity Programs

PAHAL is well recognized as Gender resource centre & gender training institute. Gender basic, advance & other related issues were addressed in training. In the year 2013-2014 P AHAL conducted trainings for departments and organizations namely Bal Niketan Sangh, Vishwas [work for positive people], National Institute of Public Cooperation and Child Development, Women & Child Department, CAT (Raja Ramanna Centre for Advanced Technology), Police department, BGMS, SRF company Pithampur, SABLA Program UNICEF, World Vision, Police training Centre Ujjain & Indore, CONCEPT and in house trainings at Indore and Barwani. In this year PAHAL conducted 20 training programs covering approx. 900 participants.

(b) VAW CAMPAIGN

Since 2005 Pahal Jan Sahyog Vikas Sansthan is regularly running a 16 Days of Activism Campaign to make people aware on the negative impact of violence on women and children and to act against abuse, to eliminate all kinds of gender based violence. 16 Days of Activism Against Gender based Violence starts from 25 November, International Violence Against Women's Day and end on the International Human Rights Day (10)





To reinforce that eliminating all forms of violence against women is a human rights issue and that the act of perpetrating violence against women is a human rights violation. The period includes World AIDS Day and World Disability Day. The 16 Days Campaign brings the human rights framework to the heart of its work and utilizes it to ensure that both state and non state actors are held accountable for acts of violence against women.



(C)PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Community Medical Centre, Khajrana Indore

Khajrana is one of the slums of Indore City having more than 200000 populations. Khajrana is one of the most challenging slum in terms of maternal and child health, sanitation, malnutrition and nutrition, poverty, prevalence of common disease. Khajrana slum was also one of the rapidly increasing slums where a set of interventions addressing maternal and child health, prevalence of common disease, sanitation and nutrition issues are required desperately.

From January 2014 "Khajrana Medical Centre" starts its second year of functioning with the aim to deliver free health services to marginalized section of the community. In this year health facility caters services to 11486 patients, also PAHAL conducted slum meetings, community awareness programs, school education programs and mid media activities at slums to sensitize people on health issues, nutrition, safe drinking water, HIV/AIDS, TB, Malaria and sensitization on gender equity to promote women's health in the area.











Bridging the Digital Divide



Digital divide refers to the gap between those with regular, effective access to digital and information technology, and those without this access. It encompasses both physical access to technology hardware and, more broadly, skills and resources which allow for its use. Factors like gender, physical disability, physical access, age, access to the contents, and lack of ICT skills contribute to the digital divide. This project address the issue of bridging the knowledge divide, attempt is made to highlight some initiatives taken in Bhil Paltan, Badla and Rahul Gandhi Nagar at Indore by building digital centers and bridge this gap.

(e) Project Axshya

PAHAL implemented Project Axshya, to increase the case detection rate in Indore district. To increase case detection rate organization conduct meetings with village Health and Sanitation Committee and also conducted various community events to aware the PRI's and communities. ACSM activities are conducted to disseminate the awareness information on TB, HIV/AIDS and TB/HIV co-infection. In this year 156 (GKS) and 19 mid media activities and 23 School Education Program were conducted covering approx. 5000 persons during the program. Pahal also engage in sputum collection and transportation under this project.

















PAHAL promotes means of livelihood among marginalized community of the society. There is a dire need of vocational education among the unskilled people. To enhance and upliftment of such economically week and marginalized community PAHAL started employment/self employment driven vocational training courses, These courses provided to such communities either free or at a very nominal cost. Pahal is also registered with Madhya Pradesh Council of Vocational Education & training. Pahal imparts trainings on trades like medical & nursing, Sewing & tailoring and Godri making.

(g) CHILD LABOUR SCHOOL





Completing primary discipline is still a problem in rural India because of poverty & lack of access to schools. In many communities especially at tribal belts, girls after a certain age are not allowed to receive education or for that matter to even step out of the house. PAHAL's child labor school gives working & dropout children a chance to complete their education and acquire skills for better employment option in the future.

In this school participatory methods are adopted to give them chance to understand their situation, their rights & opportunities. Apart from formal education children learnt extra curriculum activities like Life Skills Education and vocational trainings leading to personality development. In this year 100 children


